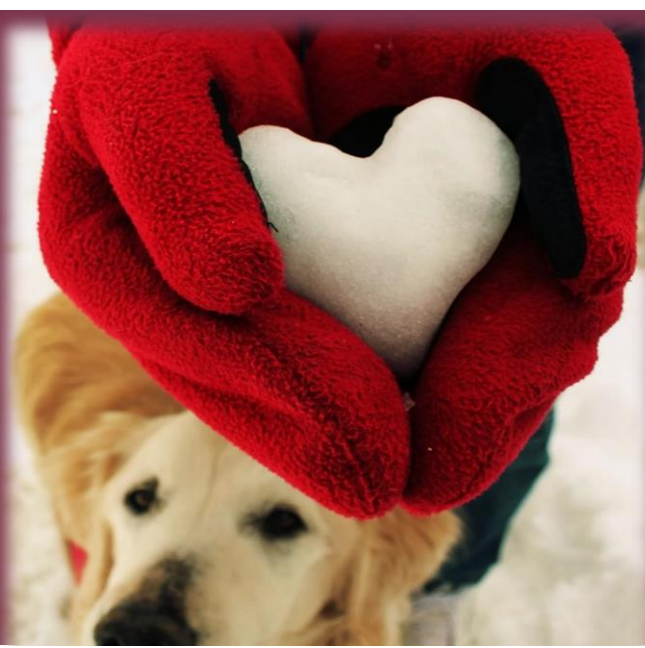

**Importance of Annual Dentals**

Veterinary medical dental care is an essential component of a preventive healthcare plan.

Annual Canine and feline dentals care is necessary and to provide optimum health and quality of life.

If left untreated, diseases of the oral cavity are painful and can ultimately contribute to internal disease, such as heart and kidney failure.

Oral bacteria gets a chance to settle and reproduce in the lining of the heart or

heart valves, a serious condition may result called bacterial endocarditis. Kidney damage and joint problems are common sequels to bacterial invasion via the unhealthy oral cavity.

**Dental Grades**

It's important to know that there are multiple stages of pet periodontal disease and without proper annual veterinary dental exam, there is no way to know if

your pet's oral health is at risk.

**Grade One:**

This is the accumulation of tartar without gingival redness and, therefore, no periodontal disease. Your pet needs a dental cleaning to remove the tartar

accumulation and help prevent periodontal disease.

**Grade Two:**

This is tartar with gingival redness (periodontal disease). This is reported to

be present in 85% of all animals in the United States over 6 years of age. Your pet needs a dental cleaning, antibiotics following the procedure, and home healthcare products to prevent recurrence. With Grade II, extractions are unlikely.

**Grade Three:**

This is tartar with gingival hyperemia, receding gums, and root exposure. A dental cleaning is needed, with antibiotics following the procedure, and oral surgery for 2-4 extractions.

**Grade Four:**

Oral surgery with multiple major and minor extractions required. Extreme Periodontal Disease, Gingival hyperemia, receding gums, and root exposure. A dental cleaning is needed, with antibiotics following the procedure.
